I hope all of you had a great year. This year has gone by at the speed of light.

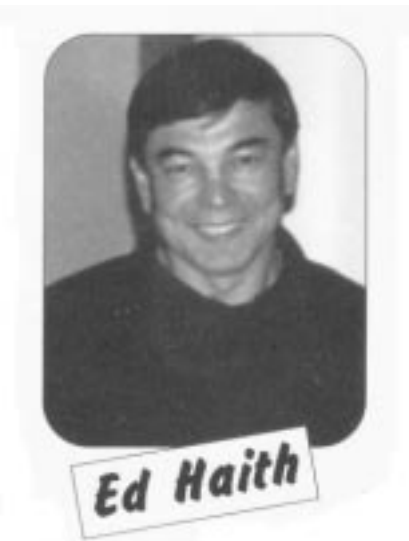

Making a difference

VSPA members should contact legislators, restate troopers' issues, concerns

It doesn't seem possible that seven months have passed since I became your Executive Director, but indeed they have. Summer is behind us, fall is in the air and winter is not far away.

With winter, of course, comes the 2005 Session of the General Assembly. In addition to managing the day to day affairs of your Association, I have spent a good deal of these first seven months traveling the state visiting with Senators and Delegates, rekindling old relationships and forging new ones.

I have been pleased with the reception we have gotten which has included a sincere interest on the part of these elected officials to learn about the issues of importance to you. Additionally, we have met with the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and the Attorney General. Also, several of the candidates for next year's elections for Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General have met with us in an attempt to learn.

With everyone we have met, we are discussing the same issues: pay, health care and

staffing. We are voicing our appreciation for what the Governor and General Assembly did for us in the 2004 session while at the same time emphasizing the need to continue that momentum in the 2005 session. Health care, particularly for our retired members, is an enormous issue.

From the "Earnings Statements" that I received from many of our retirees, I learned that our retirees are paying anywhere from \$600 to \$800 a month for their healthcare. Combined with co-pays and deductibles, many of our retirees are paying close to \$1,000 per month for

their health care. Some of our members who retired on a service related disability prior to July of 2000 are living on a monthly annuity of approximately \$350 per month. This situation is deplorable and must be addressed.

Several key members of the General Assembly have been visibly alarmed when shown these "Earnings Statements" and have voiced their intent to help us.

As I have suggested in previous correspondence with you, it would be helpful for your Delegate and Senator to hear from you about these issues. A visit, a phone call or a letter would be great ways to express your views on these matters. Also, as the Divisions and Areas begin planning for Holiday parties, please consider inviting your local Delegates and Senators.

I consider it a great honor to be able to serve you in this capacity and feel certain that by working together we can make great progress. Have a wonderful fall.

State police Drug Diversion School goes international

Roanoke - Once again, the Annual State Police drug diversion school held in Roanoke received rave reviews from the investigators who attended. Approximately 100 students, representing law enforcement and regulatory agencies from all over the United States and abroad, received a week's worth of training in all matters concerning pharmaceutical drug diversion. Two students traveled 26 hours to attend the training - all the way from Guam!

Rosanna Rabago and Robert Contreras work with Guam's Department of Public Health and Social Services. They're beginning to recognize problems with prescription drug abuse in that territory and decided they would seek training to help them combat the problem. While looking at a website sponsored by the National Association of Drug Diversion

Investigators, they saw where the Virginia State Police was offering a basic drug diversion school. They registered and shortly thereafter they were in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia.

"We are very humbled to be here," said Rosanna Rabago. "Thank you so much for having this training. This place reminds us of home, the people are so friendly."

Both Rabago and Contreras thought the training was perfect to prepare them for the problems of prescription drug abuse in Guam. "It (the training) really gave us a foundation to build on," Contreras said. They also received a tour of the Roanoke Valley and the Blue Ridge Parkway courtesy of Lt. Rod Bess of the Salem DES field office. That, coupled with winning a few door prizes, gave them quite a few good memo-

ries to take back home.

The State Police Annual Drug Diversion School began in 2001 by members of the Drug Diversion Unit, with help from the Virginia Department of Health Professions, the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators and Anthem Blue Cross/Blue Shield. This is the fourth year for the school, and it has proven to be a success each year. This is the first time students from overseas have attended the school. In the past, investigators representing agencies from as far away as Nevada and Washington state have sought the training. The first year, the school was held in Richmond. The past three years it has been held at the Wyndham in Roanoke.

Charlie Cichon, national president for NADDI, said, "You

tion to the 100 students registered, there were others on a waiting list. If the trend continues, the facilities will need to be expanded to accommodate the increased attendance.

Mission K-9 founder honored by General Assembly

Their job is to protect the public, but state police canines have little or no protection for themselves when they encounter a potentially violent situation.

A 10-year-old girl named Jessica Story is helping change that. Jessica, a student at Orchard View Elementary School in Frederick County and a resident of Stephens City, is working to provide dogs with bullet- and stab-proof vests.

On Oct. 25, Jessica was presented with a commendation from the General Assembly for her efforts. A plaque of House Joint Resolution No. 46 was presented to Jessica and her family by Col. Steve Flaherty, Superintendent of the Virginia State Police.

A luncheon at the state police academy in Richmond, attended by several members of the Department's canine unit as well as canine officers from other law enforcement agencies, was held to honor Jessica for her work.

Through her organization, Mission:K-9, Jessica has raised more than \$10,000 to buy 16 K-9 bulletproof vests for law enforcement officers' dogs. To find out more about Jessica and her mission, her website is www.missionk9.org.

Troopers win Ashe Memorial Pistol Tournament

EASTERN SHORE -- This year's Troy Ashe Memorial Pistol Tournament served as a vehicle for honors which were accorded to State Trooper Daryl Campbell who, along with his son, Drew, was killed in an alcohol-related vehicle accident on June 30 last year.

A resolution passed by the General Assembly, which honored Campbell for his years of service to his community, the commonwealth and the country, was read during the event by its sponsor, Sen. Nick Rerras.

Also, pursuant to an act of the General Assembly, Trooper Campbell's duty weapon was presented to his widow, Leigh Campbell, by Virginia State Police Superintendent Col. W.S. Flaherty

In addition, a \$1,000 scholarship established in honor of Daryl and Drew Campbell was awarded by retired State Police 1st Sgt. John Barr to Raeanne S. Tatum, a senior at Northampton High School.

In the tournament itself, competitors from local law enforcement agencies, as well as civilian shooters, stepped to the line at the newly refurbished Troy Ashe Memorial Pistol Range (formerly the Exmore Police Range), to vie for team and individual honors.

When the smoke cleared, the team from the Virginia State Police had defeated last year's

It is important to note that the Virginia Sheriff's Institute is merely acting as the conduit for this plate.

All monies raised will go to the National Law Enforcement Officer's Memorial.

A minimum number of plates must be ordered before DMV will produce the plates.

You will receive notice once the threshold has been obtained and production of the plates begins.
